WOODLAKE HIGH'S THIRD JUDGE APPOINTED TO SUPERIOR COURT.

If you grow up in Three Rivers and attend Woodlake High School, odds are pretty good that you could become a Superior Court judge. Currently, three of the nineteen judges serving Tulare County's highest court have ties to Three Rivers.

David Mathias (WHS Class of 1982) was the latest to be named a Tulare County Superior Court Judge. As a property and civil litigator in Visalia, the Woodlake high school graduate found himself taking natural steps to progress his career. Mathias began renting office space from then-attorney and now Judge Gary Paden. The pair worked in the same building that has now produced 5 superior court judges. "225 West Oak Street is a good-luck building," said Judge Paden, who also swore Mathias in. After applying for judgeship and waiting more than two years, Mathias now finds himself in a new role in the judicial system. The Visalian, who spent most of his career standing in front of the judge's bench, now sits behind it. "I have always respected judges, and now it's my job to make the calls," he said. "I will be fair and impartial, and feel honored to have this experience." Born in Tulare and raised in Three Rivers, Mathias says his ties to Tulare County are strong, making him a perfect fit for the county's newest judge.

When the father of four, registered Republican, threw his name in the hat for judgeship, he was prepared to wait. David was sworn in Dec. 27 and drove to Porterville and began learning the calendar," he said. Coming from a mostly civil and real estate background, Mathias knows it will take some time getting to used to criminal calendar he faces day in and day out in Porterville.

The other current judges are the Honorable Lloyd L. Hicks and the honorable Kathryn (Thorn) Montejano. The Honorable Lloyd L. Hicks (WHS Class of 1961) was appointed to the Tulare County Superior Court in 2003 by Gov.

Gray Davis. Lloyd was raised in Three Rivers. Lloyd graduated from Three Rivers School and Woodlake High School. He continued his education at Stanford University and began his law career in Visalia in 1969. (Lloyd was featured in the 2007 Winter/Spring Foundation Newsletter)

The Honorable Kathryn (Thorn) Montejano (WHS Class of 1971) was appointed to the Tulare County Superior Court by Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger in 2007. Kathy was raised in Three Rivers, the daughter of Craig "Bud" Thorn (1928-2009). She, too, graduated from Three Rivers School and Woodlake High School.

Kathy earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from California State University, Chico. She then earned a law degree from Lincoln Law School (Sacramento). She served as a supervising attorney for 14 years in the Tulare County District Attorney's office prior to her appointment.

WOODLAKE UNION HIGH SCHOOL MOCK TRIAL 2011 COMPETITION

The Woodlake Mock Trial Team took second place in Tulare County this year after a very successful and fun season for the team. As the defending Tulare County Champions, Woodlake Mock Trial started the new season knowing there were high expectations of the team and many other high schools in the county that were practicing hard to make sure it wouldn't happen again. The team was eager to put another win under their belt, however, most of the 2010 championship team had graduated and with only five returning players they knew their work was cut out for them.

Mr. Skeen, the teacher coach, and Erin Leedy along with husband Nathan Leedy, attorney coaches, wasted no time and worked the team into shape for the competition. The newcomers to Woodlake Mock Trial certainly stepped up to the plate too, and after several scrimmages, Orsi, Coalinga, Clovis North, and Clovis High Schools, the team was ready to dominate in the county competition. Throughout the first four rounds, Woodlake put on an astounding performance, solidly beating all of the teams that came their way. By the semifinals, Woodlake had the highest power score, and was ranked number one in the county.

In the semifinal competition Woodlake battled against El Diamante High School

for a chance at the Finals. The teams were well matched, and the trial was an exciting one. At the end of the night the verdict was out, Woodlake seized the victory by just five points.

In the final competition Woodlake found itself on prosecution verses Tulare Union on defense, the exact same teams playing the same rolls as the last finals one year prior, a nail biting close match which Woodlake narrowly won in a tie breaking vote of the scorers which sent Woodlake to the State Competition as County Champions. The night of finals was once again a very close match. Both teams showed significant improvement from last year's performance. After all the arguments were made, all the objections satisfied, and the verdict announced, the scorers determined that Tulare Union would move on to State, again by a margin of only five points.

WOODLAKE ACADEMIC DECATHLON TEAM BRINGS HOME 33 MEDALS

What is Academic Decathlon? A commitment for a weekend, a way to show off one's intelligence, a couple days worth of tests are all possible definitions. The basics of Academic Decathlon are students are broken up into three categories: varsity, scholastic, and honors. The students proceed to take a series of ten tests consisting of art, music, social science, economics, math, language and literature, written and oral super quiz, interview, speech, and essay. This strenuous weekend is concluded with an awards assembly. A medal is the award for being one of the top students in the category of the test in the county. Kelsey Ruehling won a trophy for having the top combined score in her division.

The program has a theme that changes every year. In the past, the themes have been Latin American Culture (2009), the French Revolution (2010), and this year the Great Depression. The themes reflect on what the super quiz will be composed of that year. For example, this year the art, music, and super quiz all concerned the 1930s culture. This indirectly led the students to be more aware of this country's past.

Woodlake has a growing reputation of being an Academic Decathlon supporting school. In the last few years, Woodlake has had one of the largest teams going into the competition. The team appreciates the funding and support of the school and our coaches Mr. Kevin Skeen and Mr. Shaun Summers.

This year the team was extremely successful. They brought home a total of 33 medals and a trophy. They would have won more but attendance was less than stellar on the second day. This led to Kaweah Vines stepping in at the last moment as an alternative and the team was thankful for her assistance. Every member that was present both days received at least one medal. The team was topped only by Harmony Magnet in Strathmore by a few points. If all members were present, the team could have been competing for a chance at state.

All in all, the team is proud of their efforts. However, our goal next year is a county small school championship. With a little bit more effort on studying, and a little bit more effort on attendance, we can undoubtedly achieve that goal. With member population and medals going up, our team is growing in strength year after year. There truly is strength in numbers.

ASSISTANCE SERVICE DOG EDUCATIONAL CENTER

Gerald (WHS Class of 1967) and Donna Whittaker (WHS Class of 1969) established ASDEC as a second career after their first retirement in 2002. Formed in partnership with Woodlake High School, ASDEC is the only program of its kind in the nation to utilize high school students to train service dogs and to place the dogs at no cost to special needs clients.

Woodlake High School students are personally selected by the Whittakers, who blend at-risk kids with a variety of other students. Each participant commits to the two year program. The students' personal growth as a result of this program is astounding. They learn responsibility, compassion, discipline, and the value of giving of themselves, while developing professional level skills -- impressive life-lessons for anyone, let alone teenagers!

While the benefit to these students is extraordinary, the effect on the recipients of the service dogs, who may be challenged with overwhelming physical, mental, and developmental disabilities, is nothing less than miraculous.

Upon certification, ASDEC-trained service dogs, have learned over 90 commands. They perform an array of tasks, from picking up objects, pulling wheelchairs, opening and closing doors, turning switches on and off, to predicting seizures. The dogs, which are carefully partnered, then further trained to be with their new owners, become constant and caring companions, offering their owners stability and happier, more independent lives. Currently, ASDEC is filling an immense need by supplying service dogs to veterans suffering from Post-traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

The Whittakers are expected to permanently retire at the end of this school year. A support club has been formed to help with the transition into the center's next phase. New members are welcome! If interested, contact ASDEC.

Woodlake School District has been very supportive of this organization and will continue to provide program infrastructure, the schoolhouse, kennels and utilities. However, budget cuts are hurting this program. Funding for the Whittakers' replacement and other operating expenses will have to be raised annually for the program to continue.

While the ASDEC Booster Club is actively writing grants and sponsoring fund-raising events, we need your support. In spite of many hardships growing up, many of us have been blessed with success in our adult lives. We now wish to help other Hispanic graduates from Woodlake High School who are currently growing up in circumstances very similar to ours.

These friends who grew up together in Redbanks created a scholarship fund for a worthy Woodlake High School student. A student determined to attain a college degree. Initially, the Redbanks Foundation raised \$600 and was able to provide a scholarship to an outstanding Woodlake graduate. The following year 2009 they were able to raise \$1,000 to help two ad-

ditional students. In 2010, another \$1,000 was provided. The goal was to raise \$2,000 for the Redbanks Foundation.

With this amount we will assist four students. Each will receive a \$500 scholarship.

All Redbanks Foundation applicants work through a rigorous application process which includes multiple interviews. One hundred percent of all donations are used by the student recipients.

Ana Hilaria Carretero

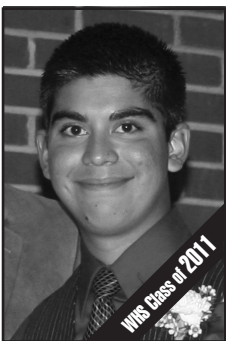

Vanessa Reynoso

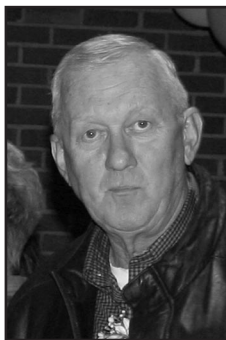

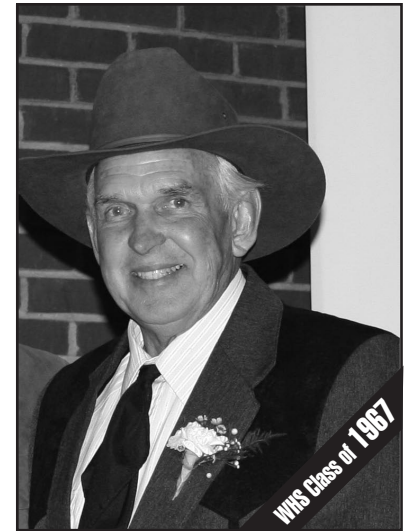

They put together support and started the Assistance Service Dog Education Center, refurbishing the old St. John's schoolhouse. Together, Gerald and Donna have mentored teenagers, trained dogs and sought to match them with the appropriate clients. It has been a great community project, even though it hasn't been easy. Every day, rain or shine, in good health or ill, Gerald and Donna have cared for the dogs and the students. Lately, their clients have included retired military who suffer from Post-Traumatic Stress. These dogs, trained by the students, work miracles in the lives of those who have protected our freedom at home and abroad.
